Junior Postdoc researcher Population and Healthy Ageing

The Faculty of Spatial Sciences is developing a faculty-broad research focus entitled Population Decline and (Healthy) Ageing. The Department of Demography takes the lead in developing the theme of Population and Healthy Ageing, also in collaboration with epidemiologists of the Faculty of Medical Sciences/UMCG and sociologists of the Faculty of Behavioural and Social Sciences of the University of Groningen. Preliminary outlines on the research programme are available and can be consulted.

The postdoc researcher will, in the field of Population and Healthy Ageing:

spend 90% of the time on research:

- conduct own research and publish on it
- develop a research programme with senior and PhD researchers
- coordinate different joint research related activities (workshops, e.g.)
- write proposals for funding agencies

spend 10% on teaching:

- (parts of) relevant courses in the Minor Population Studies (Bachelor) and the Master Population Studies.
